RESULT ANALYSIS OF BOARD EXAMINATION 2022-2023

Class XII

A total of 119 students appeared for the board examination, and all of them successfully cleared it. In terms of exceptional performance, 10 students from the Science Stream have scored above 90%. Furthermore, 24 students from the Science Stream have scored above 80%. In Commerce Stream, 1 student scored above 90%. Additionally, 7 students have scored above 80%.

Our students have topped Kuwait in Economics with 99 and Biology with 97 marks.

Class X

165 students appeared for the class X board examination and all of them successfully cleared it. 19 students have scored above 90% and 26 students have scored above 80%. Reeba Roy has topped Kuwait in Mathematics with 100 marks.
